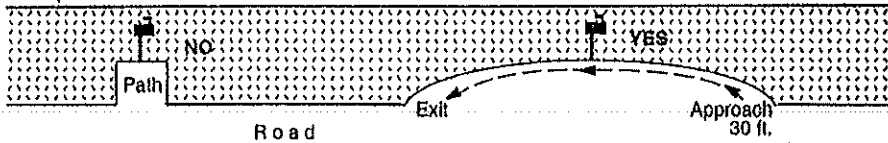

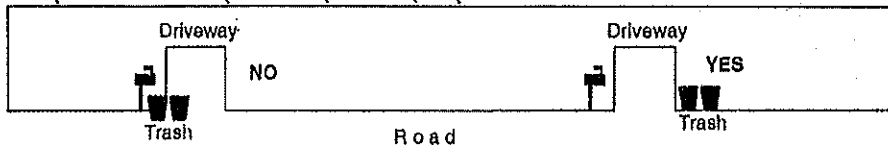
Approaches to Curbside Mailboxes
